Dear Parents/Carers,

It has certainly been a cold and frosty week with temperatures falling as low as –8 degrees in some areas. This week has been very busy in school as we have had our annual Owls review which was led and conducted by the CEO of the Trust and an Ofsted registered inspector. Taking place over the course of two days, the review looked at all of the areas that an official inspection would take into account which includes Quality of Education, Behaviour and Attitudes, Personal Development and Leadership and Management with a separate focus on the EYFS department. It was an intense process and we are delighted with the feedback that we received in every area. The review team were extremely impressed with the school and with the standard of provision being offered to the children. They visited lessons in English, Maths, PE and DT, met with pupils and staff and scrutinised pupils books in all subject areas in order to reach their conclusions. Although there are no grades attached to the review as this was not an official inspection, leaders of the school were given a real insight into where the school is currently placed and crucially what we can do to improve further. The extremely positive feedback that was given is testament to the hard work and commitment that the staff and children put into the school every single day which of course we could not do without the continuous loyal support of the parents and the wider school community. We really do have a fantastic school here at Hinckley Parks and we are grateful to everyone who plays a part in making this happen.

Year 5 are getting very excited as they are preparing for their trip to London next week. This visit to the capital is a key feature of their work on Shakespeare's Richard III as they will visit the Tower of London and learn all about the story of the boys in the tower before embarking on a trip down the Thames, and then taking a sight-seeing tour of the city. It really is a great trip and we look forward to hearing all about it.

Finally, congratulations to Miss Brandrick who this week gave birth to a baby boy. Finlay arrived weighing in at 7lbs and 3 ounces. Both mother and son are doing well and we are very much looking forward to meeting the new arrival.
